Several donors recently answered the call for help from the Windmill Alliance. Document shredding is one of the key industries for participants at the Windmill Center. When their commercial-grade shredder broke, the Windmill asked for donations from its board and other community leaders. Donors responded so generously that the shredder was purchased and donations received in excess of the cost of the shredder were designated to other needs, as long as the donor agreed.

The Rev. The document shredder cuts paper into chad. The new shredder has a Level 3 security code. Government organizations, businesses and private individuals use shredders or a shredding service like the Windmill Alliance offers to destroy private, confidential or otherwise sensitive documents. Privacy experts often recommend that individuals shred bills, tax documents, credit card and bank account statements, and any other items that could be used by thieves to commit fraud or identity theft.

Rev. Perez said, "We encourage other businesses and non-profits to consider using our shredding service. Anti-burning laws, concern over landfills, industrial espionage, and identity theft concerns are creating greater demand for paper shredding, and the Windmill Alliance is ready to serve its community."
